Four-year-old Nathan was diagnosed with cerebral palsy when he was 18-months-old, and Mr Donaldson is donating

"Cerebral palsy is a very expensive disability," he said.

"The Cerebral Palsy League certainly helped with physiotherapy and speech therapy.

"They've helped us through the process to get assistance to buy things like leg braces and other medical aids."

Mr Donaldson said he decided to donate his motorbike to the charity as soon as he found out about the scheme.
